Counting on








To improve posture and strength in shoulders, arms and hands

Hook each matching finger and pull




Palms together, elbows up and push



Arms out straight (like a scarecrow). Make small circles without bending arms. Make circles bigger. Change from forwards to backwards.



Superman pose. Lie on tummy. Lift arms and legs but keep them straight, do not bend when lifting.



Lie on back. Hug knees, lift head to touch knees with nose. Hold tight, do not roll to the side.

What are the benefits of Dough Disco?






